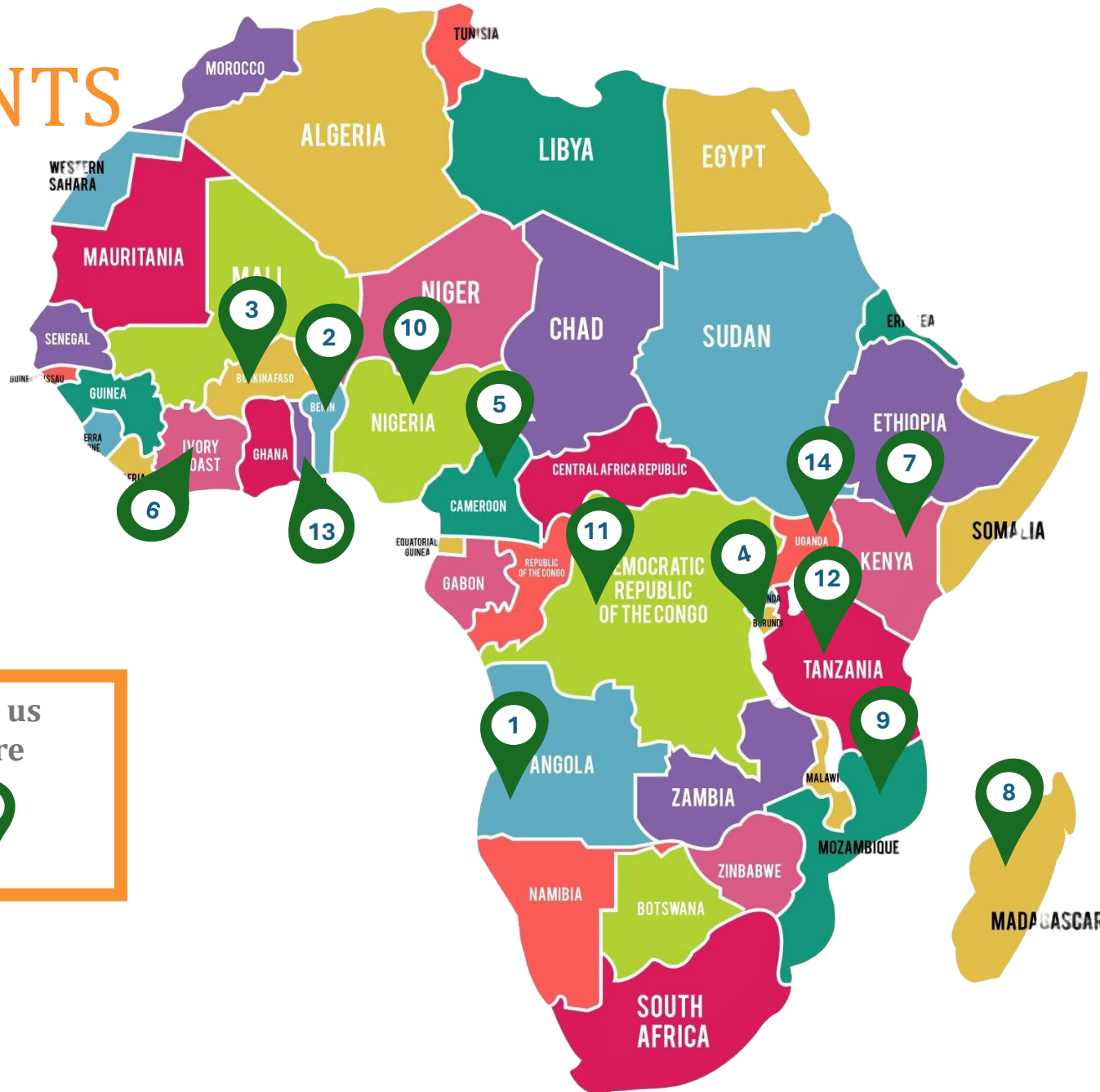

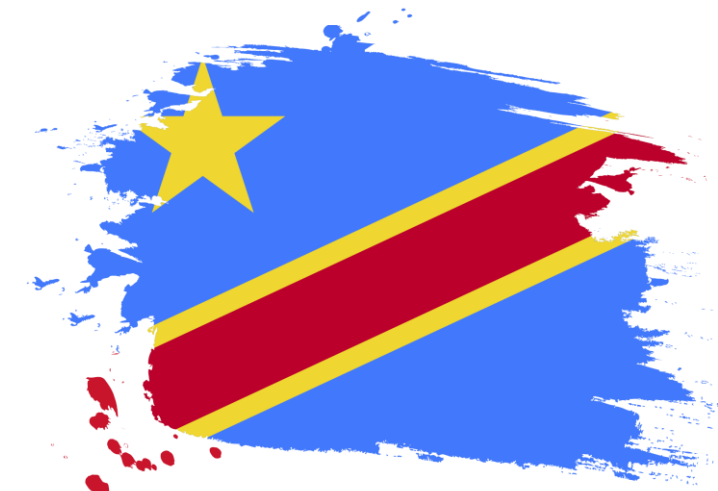

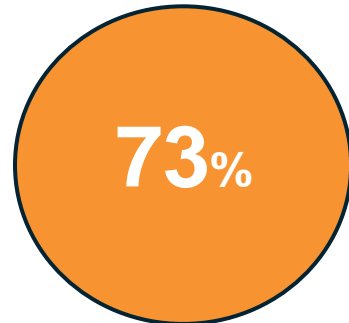

# Young Africans – Have a Say!

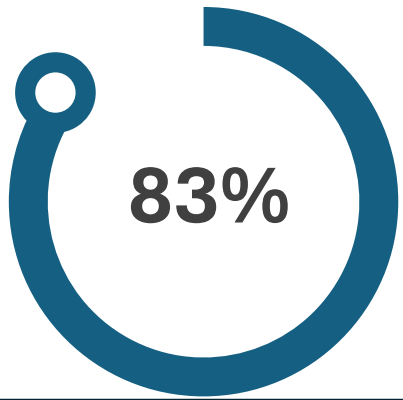


1.440 Young African adults between 18 and 40 years have started responding to the questionnaire, and 1.057 have responded to all mandatory questions.

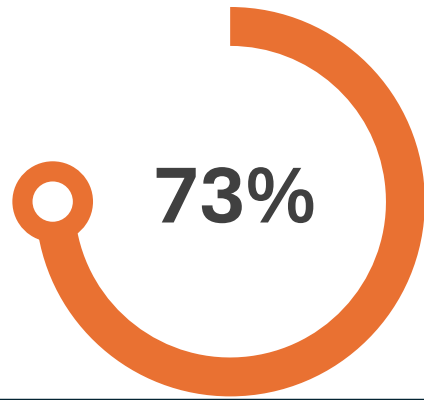

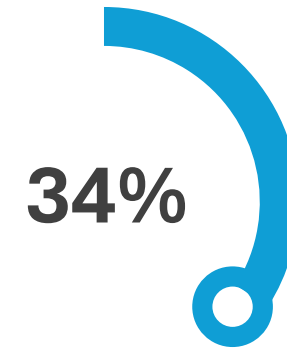

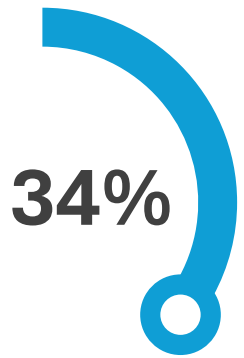

# OUR MESSAGE TO MPPU AND OTHER DEVELOPMENT PARTNERS

We appreciate the initiatives of development partners for Africa, but also the inability of our youth to take advantage of these opportunities for various reasons, including Lack of awareness, economic factors, lack of representation, skills gap, tokenism, etc.

In this regard, we (who are at the grassroots) invite you and all other development partners to

- ☑ Support us financially so that we can reach as many young people as possible and increase the impact of current and new development initiatives. We have reached 14 countries, but we want to reach all corners of the 54 African countries.
- ☑ Partner with us by implementing some of your projects through our well-organized and dispersed youth across Africa to ensure community ownership and sustainability of such projects.
- ☑ Advocate for us by linking us to the Summits on Community Based Solutions for Sustainable Development to increase our visibility and broaden the horizons of Partnerships for Goals.



# Our Recommendations for the School of Global Politics

- ✓ T4NA has trained more than 300 young people in the 1st Circle (2018-2021) and 2nd circles (2022-2025). We recommend that these two cohorts be taken into account in the selection of students for the Global School of Politics, in order to exploit this humus for greater impact.
- ✓ We recommend to accompany the T4NA tutors in doing local activities (as one of the activities towards the climax of the event) by designing a competition on project writing and implementation on issues we intend to work on in this Global School, or any other related to the cities, peace building and resilience to climate change.
- ✓ We recommend a joint advocacy action to raise funds to support youth in the implementation of the SDGs. This would involve climbing Mt. Kilimanjaro (the icon of Africa) together (MPPU, UN-Habitat, T4NA) and we would invite the local and international media to cover
